Tucson Film & Music Festival Announces 2011 Key Feature Film Line Up; Docs Make Opening Night, Centerpiece & Closing Night Films

Los Angeles, CA & Tucson, AZ -- (September 15, 2011) – The Tucson Film & Music Festival (TFMF) is excited to unveil the anchor films for the seventh annual event running from Oct. 6-10, 2011. Topping the line up are three documentaries that expose real-life narratives that prove that truth is often stranger than fiction.

The Opening Night film is the Arizona Premiere of the critically acclaimed documentary film *Better Than Something: Jay Reatard*, about the controversial and prolific rock musician Jimmy Lee Lindsey Jr, better known as Jay Reatard. This intimate portrait, captured just months before his untimely passing, brings us incredibly close to Jay's complicated punk-rock world in Memphis, Tennessee.

Bloodied but Unbowed, a chronicle of the late 70s/early 80s Vancouver punk rock scene, is the Special Presentation Centerpiece film for TFMF. The documentary tells a tale of rebellion and music in a fiercely independent scene created from nothing. Featuring D.O.A., The Subhumans, and The Modernettes to name just a few.

The Closing Night film is the Arizona Premiere of the *Kumaré*. which shares the true story of an enlightened guru from the East who builds a following of loyal disciples in the West. But this guru who so many choose to learn from is in fact American filmmaker named Vikram Gandhi, who has transformed himself into Kumaré as the centerpiece of a social experiment, which culminates in an insightful look at belief and spirituality.
